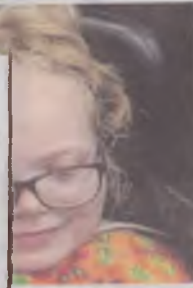

Ware Circle was also awarded the South Gloucestershire Trophy for the club with most points across the beer classes alone.

Ware Circle and its members gained seven first and 51 other places resulting in eight other trophies being awarded to the Circle and to members Peter Robinson, Elaine Robinson, Kevin Martin and Chris Evans who achieved the Master Beer Maker accolade.

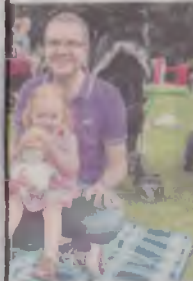
